

Study: Integration of UN Development Goal No. 8 into education at African Universities - promoting good work and sustainable economic development (SDG 8)

Background:

The promotion of decent work and sustainable economic development (as described in SDG 8) is a challenge, especially for emerging economies where occupational safety and health is still less institutionalized and not yet firmly anchored in law.

The study aims to examine the current status of the integration of SDG 8 into study programs at African universities whose courses have thematic references to safety, health and well-being at work in particular. The project is aimed at universities in all sub-regions of the African continent.

The study will investigate whether and to what extent the following four core topics of SDG 8 are addressed in the study programs and their courses: (1) impact of economic growth on climate and environment; (2) increase in socio-economic inequalities; (3) impact of digitalization on work and employment; and (4) occupational accidents and work-related diseases. The study design follows a previous study conducted in Europe.¹

Study Design:

The study focuses primarily on Master's and PhD programs in the following professional fields: (1) Occupational health and safety / Occupational hygiene, (2) Occupational medicine and nursing, (3) Management of human resources. A total of ten to twelve universities from the various regions of Africa with corresponding degree programs will be approached in order to ask questions in a semi-structured interview to responsible program directors and decision-makers at the universities.
